ASSAULT IN BRUSSELS

On Tuesday, March 22nd the violence came back to Europe, specifically in Brussels. Zaven-

tem airport, the most important of the Belgian capital, which was the scene of the first attack. After eight o'clock of that morning, two explosions took many lives. The origin of this tragedy may be of the attack of a suicide terrorist.

The services of first aid, medical professionals and ambulances quickly appeared. It has been known that a Kalashnikov rifle and a belt of explosives have been found there.

Then an evacuation protocol began with measures that included cutting access to the airport, roads and trains. Airplanes were diverted from the Belgian capital.

"I was in the line to register and then I heard a explosion. I have seen the smoke, the people with panic, running to the exit. Then has been a second explosion too, so closer to me. I was very afraid about that"- told a witness.

Investigation has identified two of the terrorists involved in the attacks in Brussels as Khalid and Ibrahim Bakraui brothers, the first of them detonated the bomb in the station Maelbeek Metro and the second, that has participate in the attack at the airport of the European capital.

We are very nervous about what the investigation will able to find. We hope this can end someday.

We Support You, Ecuador!

As you may know, in the Social Media Club we usually inform about our interests and other fun things, but today is different. As you have probably seen in the news, there has been a terrible earthquake in Ecuador. This natural disaster has led to a hideous catastrophe that has killed hundreds of people and, what's worse, has left many families with no hope of having a decent life.

Everything started on Saturday, April 17, in Manabí. No one knew that a 7.8-magnitude tremor that was felt for less than a minute would be able to destroy so many lives. It happened at 18.58 (local time), and affected lots of zones of the country. 600 people were killed and between 70,000 and 10,000 still need immediate help. It took around one day for the rescue teams to reach the affected zones. "I fear that the death toll will rise considerably," said the Ecuadorian President Rafael Correa.

Almost 230 aftershocks hit these zones again on the following days, making the damage even greater. Some of them have even hit the most tourist areas, injuring people from many other countries. Fortunately, there has already be announced that around 15,000 thousand people from the army and the police force have been mobilized to help all the affected, and many other specialists from other supporting countries, like the United States or Spain, are already on their way to Ecuador.

WADA: READY TO INVESTIGATE ON DOPING OF RUSSIAN ATHLETES

The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) affirmed that it will investigate the accusation made by British daily 'The Times' about the widespread doping in the Russian Swimming.

The British newspaper states that doping took place for many years in Russian Swimming and one of the examples used, is the case of Sergei Portugalov, a sport doctor banned by WADA for life for his role in a doping conspiracy in athletics.

However, these accusations are not based on concrete evidence and the investigation will have the goal to check them. Already in the past, the daily points out, there were two Russian swimmers whose positive tests for EPO, a banned bloodboosting hormone, in 2009 were hidden by antidoping agency RUSADA because, as the report said, the responsible doctor supporting the blood test, had police protection.

Then, through the test made by WADA, it was discovered that other Russian athletes were found positive to doping substances and so, in the future, there will be more anti-doping test on Russian athletes.

Biomedical Engineering as a Career

Biomedical engineering is the application of engineering principles to the field of health care. A biomedical engineer may design instruments, devices, and software, bringing together knowledge from many technical sources to develop new procedures, or conducting research needed to solve clinical problems. Some examples may be artificial organs, devices that replace body parts, electrical circuits, software to run medical equipment, or computer simulations to test new drug therapies.

Biomedical engineering started during WWII when a group of biologists that where making advancements in radar technology started developing electronic appliances in medicine. A gap between new technologies and the next generation of biologist who didn't understand them needed to be filled, so doctors interested in engineering and electrical engineers interested in medicine became the first biomedical engineers.

And now you may be wondering where you can study biomedical engineering... Well, some universities that offer biomedical engineering as a PhD in the United States are Johns Hopkins University, Cornell University, University of Miami, MIT or even Harvard. There are also programs in Europe at the University of Navarra, Pompeu Fabra University or the Polytech University of Madrid in Spain.

Congress 2016

As every single year since 2006, the MWC has been celebrated in Barcelona during the 22nd and the 25th of February. In this event, the main companies (Samsung, LG, Sony, Xiaomi...) announced their "top-of-the-line" mobile products for this year. These products are not only smartphones, but also they include smartwatches, tablets, wearables, Virtual Reality glasses and many more products.

This year's MWC, has led to very interesting products. Galaxy S7, the successor of the great Galaxy S6, is he best smartphone of all time for a lot of people. As some people usually say: "If it is good, do not change it". This is what Samsung did with their product: they just improved some defects of their last smartphone, and now, this is the closest device to be the "perfect device". But it has a not so perfect price, close to \$800.

In second place, and without making much noise in the event, Xiaomi has announced their new Xiaomi Mi 5. Maybe you have never heard about this franchise, but for sure it will be known by a lot of people soon. Their device, very similar in specifications to the Galaxy S7, and with some great features, is being sold about \$400 less than the Samsung device, nearly half its price.

Finally, I'd like to talk about the price that it costs to attend to the MWC. The cheapest ticket cost nearly \$800, while the most expensive one, is about \$5,000.

Now you know the main information about the Mobile World Congress, you can decide whether or not to attend next year. Until then, two more technology events will take place: the IFA in Berlin, and the CES in Las Vegas.



THE FUTURE OF THE TECHNOLOGY: GRAPHENE

Graphene is a revolutionary material made out with a common element of our nature, which is carbon. In the case of graphene, carbon atoms are distributed in an isolated layer with a hexagonal pattern, which has demonstrated to be the key element of this shocking material. In fact, it is one million times thinner than paper, so thin that it is scientifically considered as a two-dimensional product.

The history of this astonishing material started many years ago, in the decade of 1940. The scientists of the Second World War and the Post-Second World War Era investigated graphene more rudimentarily than nowadays and came up with a conclusion: two-dimension materials have no physical chance to exist. However, this statement didn't stop the research, and many other independent investigators continued trying to isolate

a single layer of graphene atoms, which was an actual challenge. Eventually, in 2002, a researcher from the University of Manchester, Andre Geim, discovered that applying tape to graphene and peeling it away could create thinner layers of this material. By 2004, he and Kostya Novoselov, his scientific mate, made public a big discovery: they have created a method to obtain isolated free-standing graphene layers. In fact, this discovery was so important that they received the Nobel Prize for it in 2010.

On one hand, this material stands out due to four characteristics: conductivity, strength, flexibility and transparency. In reference to the first characteristic, graphene is considered as a super-conductor, because it allows electricity and heat to flow with almost no interruption. In the aspect of strength, graphene is just shocking: the full weight of an adult elephant is needed to break a single layer of graphene. Apart from this, those bonds between the carbon atoms also claim a huge flexibility that gives this material the best relation ever seen between strength and flexibility. Finally, another important characteristic of this material is its transparency, as it absorbs just 2,3% of the visible light, which is a ridiculous number that means that you can see through it like you see through the air. But its best characteristic is not this, but is that graphene is auto repairable. As the main components are very abundant in the air, the carbon atoms that form this material would use the materials they find in the air to repair every damage. It means graphene is almost indestructible!

In fact, with all these amazing characteristics, graphene has a strong chance to become a revolutionary material in indefinite areas like solar power, transistors, batteries, cameras, cancer treatments or even in prosthesis. With all these characteristics, we can claim this is the future of technology!

AFTER A THOUSAND YEARS...GRAVITATIONAL WAVES

On February 11th, 2016, at a National Science Foundation meeting in Washington D.C. physicists announced a discovery that proved a hypothesis made by Albert Einstein a century ago: gravitational waves, ripples that stretch and contract space-time. A US-led collaboration of scientists has been measuring distortions in space-time for decades using a complex and sensitive instrument known as interferometer. The event that caused the distortion that was detected in this case was the collision of two giant black holes at a distance of about 1.3 billion light years from the Earth.

LIGO interferometer, which is the protagonist of this discovery, is made up of a building and two 4-kilometer-long tubes connected to the building and perpendicular to each other. A laser beam is split and directed down the tubes from the building; at the end of the tubes there is a mirror that reflects the rays back to a detector inside the building that can identify distortions 10,000 smaller than a proton. When there is a gravity wave, the two tubes are slightly stretched or contracted, so the twin beams are not aligned as they were before the distortion and therefore it is possible to detect the wave.

But what does this discovery mean to physics? Is it really important? Of course it is! First of all, it is a convincing evidence that confirms important predictions of Albert Einstein's theory of General Relativity. Moreover, as theoretical physicist Stephen Hawking said "Gravitational waves provide a completely new way of looking at the universe, the ability to detect them has the potential to revolutionize astronomy." The technology used for the measurement also opens up many new possibilities that were almost unimaginable a few years ago. Although this event might not seem important to our everyday life, scientists' view on cosmic phenomena has considerably progressed.

Life begins and ends with the heartbeat; the most perfect part of ourselves

The heart is the part of our body that sends the blood into all our cells to keep us alive. It is located in the middle compartment of the mediastinum in the chest. It lives since our birth and until our death. But it's not only the most important part of our body, it's also the symbol of love, the emotion that provides ourselves of happiness or why not, sadness. But there's people that don't know the awesome jobs of this organ.

This beautiful muscle rhythmically pumps oxygenated to the body tissues. And it does so without rest about 80 times per minute. This action is done after we were born in the placenta. "So during one day, an average of 100,000 beats pumped around 8,000 liters of blood" (Texas Heart Institute).

If we close our fist, we can find the approximate size of the heart. Sometimes it's hard to think that in this insignificant part of our big body there's an indispensable organ that does more jobs than all the other parts of our body. It would be strong enough to push a vehicle 32 kilometers!

But also this perfect organ, can produce several problems. 7.2 million people have died of heart disease. In the United States, heart disease is the leading cause of death of men and women with almost 700,000 lives taken in a year. Risk factors include atherosclerosis, diabetes, obesity and lack of exercise, high levels of LDL cholesterol and hypertension.

This organ is the place of the deepest feelings, the barometer of our emotions. From that point of view, the affections of the heart and circulatory system are manifested in people with emotional problems and difficulties expressing love. Although it's only a symbol of what we feel, we see the heart like a special part of ourselves, because it allows to feel.

Let's say that the heart is the engine of life and emotions are its fuel. Can you imagine that instead of a heart of muscle you have a machine heart? This would be a very good discovery for a technologist or scientific person, because the machines don't stop working, but where will be our feelings be?



New Planet Found in the Solar System By Miguel Lopez

Two scientists of Caltech have discovered a new planet beyond Pluto in the Solar System

These scientists (Michael Brown and Konstantin Batygin) found that some objects in space beyond Pluto, had a strange behavior and they determined that there was an object with a big gravity, a planet.

The ninth planet is 60% larger than Earth and 1200 times farther from the sun than the Earth. The orbit of the planet is more or less like 15000 Earth years. All this information is only mathematics because they haven't seen the planet because of the distance.

This important discovery has a very important effect in astronomy because it is the 3rd real planet discovery since the antiquity.
