
MAKE PLAN

Continue working on the application documents, pay the application fees, and submit before the deadline!

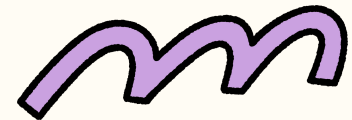
